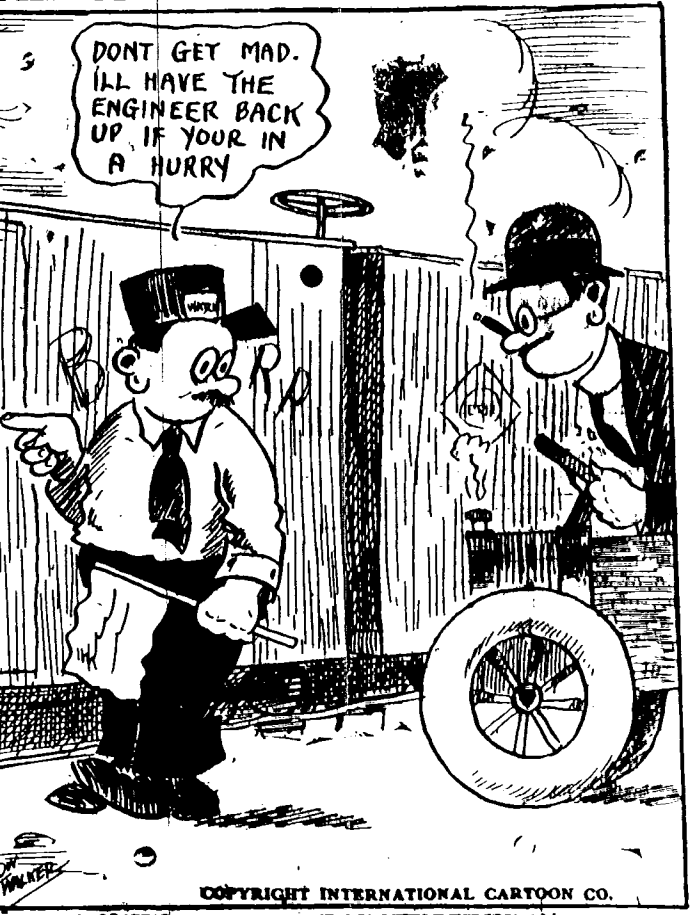

Council Approves Bridge Ordinance On Final Reading

LEMMON RE-ELECTED SCHOOL TRUSTEE TO SUCCEED SELF FOR SECOND TERM

Business of importance to the City of Jeffersonville came before the City Council at the June meeting of the board Monday night at the City Hall.

A contract between the Louisville Bridge Commission and the City was ratified by an ordinance which was given its final reading and passed unanimously by the Jeffersonville City Council Monday night. A declaratory resolution vacating certain streets, alleys and public property for the Jeffersonville approach of the new bridge was also passed finally. No remonstrance had been filed against either.

The northern approach, which is to be partly an open viaduct and partly a dirt fill will follow a straight line of running across the bridge from the Louisville side, it was pointed out Monday night. Representatives of the Commission indicated that most of the land required has already been acquired by the Commission and that which has not been secured has been condemned.

Toll houses and a toll plaza, to be erected on the Jeffersonville side, must under contract be designed for good appearance and rapid movement of traffic. The contractor relieves the City of Jeffersonville of liability for any damages resulting from construction of the approach, and provides that hearings and reasonable damages must be granted. An assessment roll, according to the contract is to be provided, which will name each property owner that might be affected.

Lemmon Re-Elected

Walter J. Lemmon was elected City School Trustee for three years by the City Council, to succeed himself for a second term, Monday night.

Upon the recommendation of Paris Spurgeon, city engineer, the Fort Street sewer was accepted by the Council.
